
Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In February, Alberto, Ash, and Arthur worked together to lead the second missionary training class for this year. The group completed the classes on Christology and Evangelism this month. Also we were especially blessed to visit with our sons, Benjamin and Joshua, and Arthur's mother, Mildred, and brother, Joel, during part of our time in the states. Arthur, Mary Alice, Benjamin and Joshua went to Clayton, Georgia for one weekend and hiked at Tallulah Gorge and Panther Creek. It was really fun, but we were sad to leave them. The boys are ok, but still are struggling trying to adjust to living in the states. Please pray that God will help them find true Christian friends and that He will protect them from temptation. On a sad note, Arthur's aunt, Betty Claxton, had been sick with lung cancer since January of this year. Right after we arrived in the states, we went to the hospital in Tifton to see her, and she was improving. Later on in the week, her condition got worse, and on February 27th, she went to be with the Lord Jesus. She was a single lady who taught accounting at University of ABAC in Tifton. She was dearly loved by all her nieces and her nephews, and was like a mother to all of them. Please pray that God will give His comfort and peace to all of Arthur's family, and especially for Mildred and Bashi who are the last two living siblings of Betty.

Willy is a Catholic man who Arthur led to the Lord Jesus, and has studied with us in a discipleship group. He now helps Arthur disciple the Shoe Shine boys in the park downtown. If you have been to Peru, Willy is one of the waiters at the restaurant Caramba's in Huancayo, where many of our teams have a meal. He still attends a Catholic church, and although he doesn't agree with all of the teachings there, he feels like God wants him to stay in that church. We would really like to begin discipleship among Catholic groups as well, so Arthur and Willy made an appointment to talk with the priest of Willy's church to see if he had any interest in studying with them. He was not very open, but Arthur gave him the first six books that we use in discipleship. Please pray that God will touch the heart of this priest, so that he will be open to read these books and accept our invitation to join us in the discipling process.

In January, we were informed that the Peru ministry support would be reduced by several of our supporters. We lost almost 25% of our financial support in one month. We know times are hard economically, but we need your help to overcome this loss and continue with the ministry here. If we cannot replace this lost income by the end of April, we will have to begin to close some of the ministries here. It doesn't take much to help. If everyone who receives this newsletter that does not already help us financially, would consider giving \$10.00 or \$20.00 per month, we could make up this loss quickly. Please give praise to the Lord for bringing us additional persons called to be part of the missionary team in Peru. Covenant with us to continue in prayer for the young adult leadership team and their continued ministry to the spiritually lost and dying youth of Huancayo. Please pray for the leaders of the churches in Peru, and for their spiritual protection and growth in the Lord Jesus. Also be in prayer for Billy and Laurie Drum, Ash and Audra McEuen, Martin and Tracy Reeves, Louise Reimer, Tim and Jennifer

Goshorn, and their families. All are missionaries with the Mission Society that currently or will soon be working in Peru. Pray also for Obed and Cynthia Alvarez, the head of NEWMA, as well as their other leaders and national missionaries. Please pray for our safety as we travel, and that we will boldly speak God's Word wherever we go.
