We hope and pray that He has been blessing you wonderfully during this past month and that your life has been filled with His glorious riches and mercy.

During the first few weeks in February, we continued with our usual activities. The new discipleship group that Arthur began at the end of January seems to be going very well. We have enjoyed being with the young adults who have been coming to the group, and we are praying that the Lord Jesus will use these young adults in the universities where they are attending, in their jobs, and wherever they go to reach others for Him. We are thankful for Ivan Cruz, a young man who lives with us, who will lead the group when we have to travel to conduct leadership workshops or when we are working with teams.

One young lady, Fanny, who is coming to the group, was raised as a pastor’s child, but does not believe. She appears to be searching for a reason to believe. Please pray that the Holy Spirit would move in her to fully reveal Jesus Christ to her.

Arthur and Moisés García completed the water tower that they have been working on for our house. Now when we have events at our house we will have enough water for everyone to use. Also, there will be hot water all day long, not just when the water pressure is high. We are grateful to the Lord Jesus for allowing us to complete this project.

Jorge Ayala visited us for a few days in February. He will not only be leading the missionary team in the jungle, but he will now be managing the farm. He is working hard on organizing people to work on the farm. Even though the farm has been a great challenge for us due to problems with the previous two managers we had, we feel that God wants us to be patient and continue with it, because he does have a purpose for it. This change will more directly involve our national missionaries in the project that will ultimately be used to sustain their work.

We started discipleship work in this area in April of 2013, and we now have discipleship in four native communities and four colonial communities. We are working on relationships that will allow us to enter two more native communities, hopefully this year. Please pray that God will give Jorge wisdom as he takes on the task of being the farm manager and of continuing to be the leader of all the national missionary team in the Asháninka and colonial communities in the jungle.

We were very privileged to be able to attend the Roswell United Methodist Mission's Conference the last week of February. We shared about what God is doing in Peru with two groups of people in homes and with several Sunday school classes. This church is very involved with us in supporting the discipleship in the Amazon region, and we are very grateful to God for them. John Pearson is one of our key supporters in the project and also a member of Roswell United Methodist Church.


