We hope and pray that you had a wonderful Christmas and New Year, that the Lord Jesus has been blessing you wonderfully during this past month, and that your life has been filled with His glorious riches and mercy.

We want to take this opportunity to let you know that The Mission Society changed its name in January. The new name is TMS Global. The new web address is [www.TMS-Global.org](http://www.TMS-Global.org). We are still the same organization, but with a new name.

In February we were constantly busy, and we were privileged to share about what is going on in Peru with many couples and small groups. During the first week, we were blessed by traveling to Madison, Alabama to share with the people in Asbury First United Methodist Church, which is a church that has supported us for some time. We had a great time sharing with several of the pastors in the church, Alan Weatherly, Tommy Gray, and Chris Montgomery. Ted Amey, who is the pastor in charge of prayer, was gracious to allow us to speak at the prayer and healing service too. We are thankful to God that Chris, who is the pastor of discipleship, will be bringing a small team from this church in July to refresh and encourage our key leaders. Also, we were encouraged by spending time with Rhonda Dahlin, the Mission Director at Asbury, who has always supported us so well. Bob and Catherine Sloan had a very nice group meeting for us in their home, and the people that came were encouraged about the great things that God is doing. Julie and Tom Maxon, as well as Stacey and John Franklin, served us with their

hospitality by letting us stay in their home and encouraging us as well. The Franklins have adopted another son from China, Eli, who we enjoyed meeting for the first time.

We also had some important business to do in the states, such as updating our vaccines, our wills, and other things, because, unfortunately, we aren't getting any younger. Arthur has been working on repairing our house where our daughter, Mary Beth, and her family live, as he has a chance, because our last renters really messed it up.

While we were in the states, Pastor Beto had a leadership meeting with some of our key leaders about how they will take more responsibility in the ministry, and how they will become independent from us. Beto said that they felt freer to share while we are in the states than when we are in the house in Peru. A couple of our leaders conducted leadership workshops in our absence, as well. These are good signs to us. Please pray that God will continue to give them wisdom to become independent of us, financially and spiritually, in His timing.

It was a miracle that everyone could do that the same day, because everyone is so busy and has different schedules. She is so blessed that God has given her such a wonderful family! Since January, Oscar, Mary Beth's husband, has gotten another job, so thank you for your prayers for him.


