Arthur and Moisés are still working on the cacao solar dryer to get it to work as effectively as possible, and they are doing several tests on it to improve it. Also, the hot water in our kitchen depends on the water pressure that we have, so each day when the city cuts off the water there isn't much pressure, and as a result the water heater does not work. For this reason, Arthur is designing a small water tower with a storage tank to provide water when it is cut off, and to increase the pressure so that the water heater will work all of the time. God has given Arthur many talents and gifts, and Mary Alice is so thankful for that!


