Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ. We praise the Lord God for all He is doing in our lives and in the ministry here in Peru, for filling us with His Holy Spirit to guide and direct each of our steps, and for pouring out His grace upon us through His precious Son, Jesus Christ. We hope that the Lord Jesus has been blessing you wonderfully during this past month, and that your life has been filled with His glorious riches and mercy. We are so thankful to God for you.

July brought many positive advances. The Board of Directors of the Fraternidad Misionera, the organization we formed in Peru to do ministry, voted to become a volunteer organization, not having any more salaried positions. This is a positive step toward making it independent. The current officers are Beto, president, Darwin, vice president, Ricardo, secretary and treasurer. They are all board members, as well, along with Arthur. Please be in prayer for them as they take this big step of providing for their own support, especially during these difficult political and economic times here in Peru. This is a real step of faith for them.

The coffee harvest was finalized this month. The person that was in charge of the coffee did a very poor job and will not return to work with us next year. Because of his poor performance we lost approximately half of this year’s harvest. In spite of this we made enough profit to pay all of next year’s cost except the harvest, which will pay for itself, and still have some earnings left. Lúcio, the person in charge of the cacao will take on the responsibility for the coffee next year, as well. We are currently starting into the high season harvest for cacao for this year. Please be in prayer for Beto, Lúcio, and Lúcio’s family as they work together in these projects.

So that you can know our farm team a little better, Lúcio and Marita are married and their children are Marcela, Luciana, and Lúcito. Marcos and Jorge are Lucio's brothers, and Manuel is his nephew. Jorge's wife, Jenifer and his son, Edson, are currently in their home in Cabayacocha (located in the northeast of Peru near the Colombian border about 3 hours from Iquitos), where Jenifer is currently finishing her nursing practice. They will be coming to the farm in September to join the team. Jorge and Jenifer are expecting a second child in December. Ivan and Saúl live in Huancayo and work with Arthur and Beto. They help Arthur with the farm improvement projects and Beto with other ministry activities.

Arthur, Mary Alice, Ivan and Saul, traveled to the farm to start construction of the bathroom project. Arthur and Donato rode together in Donato's truck carrying all of the materials and tools. Ivan, Saúl, Beto, and Mary Alice rode together in our truck. After unloading on the farm, we loaded Donato's truck with coffee and some cacao for sale in Pangoa, and he and Beto returned to Pangoa to sell them. Lúcio, Marcos, Manuel, Jorge, Arthur, Ivan and Saul installed the drain field, and biodigester (a special kind of septic tank), all the sewer and waterlines and the foundation, floor, and sidewalk. Eventually, there will be two bathrooms with toilets and sinks, as well as two separate showers. God was good to us because it only rained a couple of days, and the first phase was successfully completed.

Ivan, Arthur, and Saúl also installed improvements to the solar electrical system increasing its capacity. They added a solar panel, a new, more efficient charge controller, and power inverter. They moved the older components to the system on the house, doubling its capacity. Now there is electricity all the time, and the satellite internet functions around the clock. We will now have electricity for lighting in the bathrooms, when they are complete. We hope to bring a small refrigerator and additional solar capacity dedicated to it on our next trip. Please be in prayer for Arthur as he prepares all the materials and fabrications for the final phase of the bathroom construction and the additional electrical improvement projects on the farm.

Mary Alice had fun getting to know Lúcio's wife, Marita, their daughters, Marcela and Luciana, as well as their baby son, Lúcio. Marita worked so hard cooking for everyone during this time, and she had a very joyful attitude while she was doing it. One day Mary Alice was able to teach a few children a little bit of English at the school, but after that one day, the children had a two week break. Hopefully on the next trip, the children will be back in school, so that she can teach them some more English.

Lúcio is the President of the APAFA, which is like our PTA. He is very enthusiastic about everything that he does and is making a good influence in the community of Pachucotec. On Sundays, the community gets together and plays volleyball and soccer. They really enjoy getting to know one another while playing sports. There were over thirty people there when Mary Alice went. More people have moved into the community, since Lúcio and his family have been working at the farm, and he was one of the people who was a big influence in getting the school started. Praise the Lord for what He is doing in this community, and please pray that one day that all will come to know the Lord Jesus Christ. There is definitely a mission field there.

Beto and Darwin conducted an inductive Bible study workshop in Pampas Ocopilla in Huancayo. Pedro Duran led a discipleship group in this place for three years before he passed away. This workshop was for new believers in Christ, and it went very well. In addition, Beto and Darwin visited a brother in Christ, Rubén Gabriel, who lives in this same area.


3. Pedro Castillo is the President of Peru now. Please pray that he will govern Peru as God wants him to.
