We want to give you special thanks for your continued prayers for us and support of the ministry in Peru. We definitely see the results of your prayers for us and for the ministry here. You are special people called by our Lord Jesus Christ to minister to His children. Thank you for your faithfulness to His calling. Thank you for your love for Him, for us, and for His children.

Mary Alice has begun to write a Kid’s Club lesson each week again. In the past she has written over 140 lessons that are currently being used. She loves writing the lessons, but is often short of time. Please pray that she will have inspiration from the Holy Spirit and God’s wisdom to write exactly what God wants, and the time necessary to write them. Also, please pray that God will give His words and wisdom to the teachers that are teaching in the Clubs and that the children will continue to grow in their relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ.

In June, Arthur and Eric continued working very hard on the machine that will make plastic bottles and the oven. They are very close to finishing it, but they need to be able to completely form the bottom of the bottles. This is the hardest part to form. With up coming ministry activities and Eric returning to the states at the end of July, they are also short on time. Please pray that they will have the time and God’s wisdom to finish as fast as possible.

June 29th was the 5th anniversary of Mary Beth's school. During the month of June, there were several activities to celebrate. The school conducted a presentation in the local mall, and most of the classes did a dance, played a song with musical instruments, or did a drama. Also, a famous clown in Peru whose son is part of the school was part of the entertainment, and at the end, he presented a short gospel presentation. Also, another day the parents of the students and some of the teachers in the school were participants in the anniversary celebration. The parents of Mary Beth's class dressed up like clowns and did a skit to explain freedom in Christ. Please pray that each student, parent, and teacher in Jesus El Maestro High School will come to know Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord of their lives, and pray for Miss Luz Coz, the director of the school.

Lisbeth has been working in the work in Palcazu, which is a town in the jungle that has become quite dangerous because of drug trafficking problems and terrorist problems. Recently, all her identification documents, money, and belongings were stolen, and she indicated that the police were not willing to let her file a report to get her documents replaced. Please pray that God will be with Lisbeth, and that she can get her documents replaced as soon as possible.

In July, there will be a medical campaign in San Juan de Iscos, which is a small town outside of Huancayo. Susy Carbajal is working very hard in Patarcocha, a town near Iscos, and people are coming to know the Lord. Sunday afternoons she teaches Sunday School to some of the

parents and the children. In the future when Susie goes to study in Lima at NEWMA, Lisbeth and her mother Alejandra Aquino will be working there to continue to evangelize and to do discipleship. Please pray that many people will come to know the Lord in the medical campaign and that they will be healed physically and spiritually.


