

Several of them now have good stable jobs and families. Many of them have stopped drinking and using drugs.

Willy, who works with Arthur, is an ex-alcoholic, and has been trying to help with these problems as well as assist Arthur in the discipling process. We praise God for what He is doing in the lives of these young men. Please continue to pray that all of them will continue to grow in Christ, and that they will be set free from all of their strongholds. Also, please pray especially for Mayta that he can be free from alcohol and drugs.

Please pray that God will encourage each of them to be faithful to come each week so that they can grow in their relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ.

Three interns have arrived to help the missionary team in Peru - Rachel Robertson, Emily Heinz, and Taylor Knapp. Rachel will be working with Ash and Audra McEuen, and Emily and Taylor will be working with Susie Carbajal in Patarcocha. The Drums have started a small school there for 4 year olds whose parents don't have money for school, and they also conduct a Kid's Club there. Susie has worked with us for a long time, and has had a lot of experience working with children in Clubs and also doing Discipleship Groups. Please pray that God will put his angels around all the interns, that they can adapt quickly to the culture, and that God will use them in a mighty way to advance His Kingdom here in Peru.

In January, we were informed that the Peru ministry support would be reduced by several of our supporters. We lost almost 25% of our financial support in one month. We know times are hard

economically, however, you can still help us to overcome this loss and continue with the ministry here. 
