In November, part of our Anapati team, Jorge, Luis, and César visited us for 10 days to coordinate with Arthur for the work next year and to raise money to buy the Paneton (Christmas bread) and hot chocolate for the Christmas celebration with the Ashaninkas in Boca Anapati. Jorge returned later in the month with David, David, Norma, and Zulema, who will also be working in the Ashaninka communities. We are also planning on adding at least two more workers to the team in January, Yenet and Josué. Please pray that Jesus will continue to move in a great way in the hearts of the Ashaninkas, and that He will use the missionary team to minister to them.

Beto, Arthur, and Mary Alice conducted basic leadership workshops in Castillo Grande and Cayhuana approximately 12 hours north of Huancayo. Both workshops seemed to go well. We were very happy to have Brayan, Sarvia's son, in the workshop in Cayhuana. Sarvia leads several discipleship groups in Panao, and came to the missionary training event that the Mission Society held two years ago. Brayan was very interested in participating and learning how to disciple others, as well as Dante, Dora, Dora Liz, and Epifania. Please pray that God will encourage all of the participants to begin their own discipleship groups in the future.

Arthur is also doing the yearend inventory of all the medicines, supplies and equipment, and discipleship books for the ministry, as well as a number of other small tasks.

We have been discussing and praying about how and when we could include a workshop in 2015 to train additional workers to use this technique.


We pray that each of you will have a wonderful Christmas filled with the love, joy, and peace of the Lord Jesus Christ.
