We were very blessed to have a team from Riverstone Church come and teach us some new tools to use for healing prayer in our prayer ministry in late September. Javier Palomino, who is the director of the Colegio El Camino school, and is in one of Arthur’s discipleship groups, was prayed for by the team when they were here. It helped Javier so much that he looked for information on the ministry using the internet, and downloaded and studied the training manual. He then began to use the healing prayer in the school with parents and students. The ministry is bringing fruit in the school, and Javier hopes to begin to incorporate his teachers in the ministry, as well. He shared with Arthur that it is really helping people. In the future we are planning to train other Peruvians that would like to be involved in this ministry, as well. Please pray that God will work in a mighty way in Javier and his wife Teresa, as they use this prayer to help others to be free in Jesus. Also, please pray that God will give us wisdom to do a great job with the training sessions that we are planning to do in the future.

In October, the Drums and the McEuens hosted a team from Covenant United Methodist Church from Dothan, Alabama. They worked in a school in Tinyari, where the Drums have begun to do a Kid's Club during the children's weekly religion class. It is a state school, and the government requires that the children have two hours a week of religion studies, so after hearing about the schools that Billy and Laurie have in Iscos and Patarcocha, the director asked the Drums to come teach religion in their school.

We enjoyed helping translate a couple of days during the week. The children rotated to four different areas each day. One area was the Bible area, where they heard a Bible story, watched a drama, and did a craft. Another area was the sports area where they learned to play kickball, T-ball, ultimate Frisbee, and to play with a big parachute. Another area was where the children learned some English, and the last area was where Audra and Ash McEuen read books to the children and let them do some type of activity, such as frosting cookies or making a craft. The children, the teachers, and the team all seemed to have a great time. The teachers now want to begin their own Bible study apart from the Kid's Club.

Besides these events, we have been doing our regular activities each week. Mary Alice is really enjoying writing Kid's Club lessons based on the discipleship materials and making up new choreographies with the girls in the Kid's Club in Pichcus. Also, God has blessed us with two more teachers. Andrea worked with us in the Clubs in the past, and has returned, and Lucia Garcia is a new worker, who is the sister of Karen, Pastor Alberto's wife. Please pray for more workers for the children's ministry, and that God will continue to move in the hearts of all the children in the Clubs so that they will have a really close relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ.

Arthur is still being blessed by his time with the Shoeshine boys and his three other discipleship groups. Also, he is working on formatting the Kid's Club lessons because we want to get them copyrighted for more wide spread distribution. In addition, when the time allows, he is working on the bottle making machine trying to improve the production speed. Please pray that God will give him guidance as he continues to lead the mission here.

This month Mary Alice's mother, Mary Anne Nash, had to have surgery to remove a tumor from her lung. The tumor turned out to be malignant, but the cancer had not spread to her lymph nodes. We praise God that the tumor was found and removed without any complications. Please pray that God will continue the healing process in Mary Anne as fast as possible, and that he would give her His peace.

Mary Beth, Benjamin, and Joshua are continuing to work hard in school. Mary Beth was still in first place in her class as of mid terms this month. Joshua had three "A's" and a "C" at mid term. You probably won't be surprised that the "C" was in English. Benjamin is still doing

well, with what appears to be “A’s” and “B’s”. Please pray that God will continue to guide them and protect them in everything that they do.
