We praise the Lord God for all He is doing in our lives and in the ministry here in Peru, for filling us with His Holy Spirit to guide and direct each of our steps, and for pouring out His grace upon us through His precious Son, Jesus Christ. We hope and pray that He has been blessing you wonderfully during this past month and that your life has been filled with His glorious riches and mercy.

During October, we had the privilege of praying for more people using the SOZO method of ministry. Pastor Beto and Karen prayed for a young man, and it went very well. Alejandra prayed with four people and saw very good results. Also, Louise Reimer, Mary Alice, and Arthur prayed for a young lady, and God freed her in a great way. Please continue to pray that we will have more opportunities to pray for other people who need to be set free from strongholds and unforgiveness.

Arthur has been working hard on designing and making a solar dryer to dry cacao (chocolate beans). He is working on a prototype for testing and hopes to have it ready for use by next summer. Ultimately we will need to build 12 of these dryers, one for each hectare of cacao crops that we have planted. Please continue to pray for this project to help raise support for the work from Peruvian sources.

Many of the young people who work in Boca Anapati and Puerto Anapati graduated from the EMLA Mission School on October 18: David Vargas, César Huaman, Norma Molle, Jenet Orbezo, and David Cairuna. They will be continuing to work with us in the jungle full time now. Please pray that God will continue to use them to minister to the Peruvians and to the Ashaninkas, and that God will provide the funds for them to do this.


