Angie has been friends with Milagros for a good while because their daughters study at the same school, and through this friendship, Angie became interested in participating in a workshop that Beto did about a month ago at the Salcedo family’s house.

Angie and Luciana accepted the Lord Jesus recently, as a result of having several contacts with other believers. This is a wonderful example of how the Lord uses believers who are friends and different circumstances to attract people to Jesus. Most of all God's Word has touched Angie's and Luciana's hearts to follow him.

The virtual discipleship groups are still going strong by meeting once a week. Some of the groups that Beto facilitate had a break this month after finishing with the book that they were studying in the Bible. There are about ten virtual groups meeting together with about eight mentors leading them with a total number of one hundred twenty participants.

There are about thirty groups meeting together in person each week with twenty-three mentors, and three hundred fifty-five participants. The numbers are really not important; what is important is that each person is growing in Christ and learning to discipleship others by just using the Bible and the Holy Spirit.

This month Marcos' wife, Tabita, and his in-laws, Florencio and Evelia, arrived at the farm. They will help Marcos with the farm work, the construction of a new platform for the water tanks, and more than anything Marcos now has some company in the house and some extra help. His nephew, Manuel, returned to the farm to work again too, so Marcos is happy with his family being there with him.

Florencio and his wife, Evelia, live on the Santa Rosa island in the Amazon Jungle, at the border of Brazil and Colombia. Florencio is a businessman, but he is also a pastor of an independent local church. Evelia and he decided to spend a few months in the Pachacutec Community to help Marcos and Tabita with the farm work.

When the rainy season was over, a series of diseases affected the cacao plants, so Juan Crispin and his engineers came to see this serious plant situation and to give recommendations for what to do. In August, the farm team will do three things to treat the disease that is affecting the plants: bag up the diseased cacao pods, prune the plants, and spray them with appropriate chemicals to kill the diseases. This time, they will use synthetic products on the plants that will help them resist diseases. In spite of the diseases, the farm team still had a small harvest.

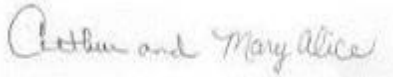
Prayer Requests and Praises for July

5. Please pray against the increased violence by the Shining Path Terrorist in the VRAEM, the region where the farm is.

Please continue to pray for each one of our workers and for each one of the ministries and projects, the discipleship ministry, the evangelism and church planting ministry, the prayer ministry, and the work to self-sustain these ministries.
