(Matthew 10:7) Everyone was encouraged to share about Jesus wherever they were. In addition, there was a special time for women and men to gather separately and study God’s word together. They fed us well, loved us well, and gave us plenty of time to rest. The last night was meaningful because it was a testimony time about what God had done in people’s lives. The majority of those who shared were the youth. Praise God for supporters who love us and care for us!

We also enjoyed visiting and sharing about what Jesus is doing in Peru with another supporting church, Thomaston Methodist Church. It was a privilege to meet the new pastor, John Halley, who had only been at the church for about six months.

Bernabe, our man of peace who lives in Boca Anapti, shared with Beto that several Ashaninka communities suffered floods recently. The flood especially affected the community of Yoyoto, where we conducted a medical campaign two times in the past. Many people who live near the Yoyoto River and the Ene River lost houses, harvests, and animals. Bernabe is especially concerned about Domitila and Wilder, who lost part of their house too. The flood waters in both rivers have receded significantly. We are thankful that God is with these people, will give them His strength, and will take care of them, because He is a good Father..

At the farm, there was a small harvest of chocolate beans this month, and the team is waiting for the big harvest. The coffee is ready to be harvested, and the bananas have been producing, but in February, the banana buyers weren’t able to come to the farm because of the bad road conditions caused by the excessive rains and flooding.

Mary Alice celebrated her sixty-fifth birthday with Arthur, Mary Beth’s family, and Benjamin and his wife, Emily. What a blessing it was!


Prayer Requests and Praises for March
