Elizabeth, a young lady who lives in Huancavelica, participates in a discipleship group with Antonella and a group of youth. A long time ago, she accepted the invitation to go to the group, but she didn't continue going because she thought it was more important to go to the traditional church services, especially because her parents are the pastors there. She began to have some uncomfortable questions about the church, and when she was invited to come back to the discipleship group again, she returned to it, even though she had attended the traditional church for all of her life and felt obligated to go there.

As she began to study the Bible more, it was changing her heart and teaching her completely new things. As a result, she began to be very excited about learning about Jesus. Elizabeth told Beto that she loved her parents a lot and that she always has wanted to obey them, but since she has been studying the Bible in a more open and critical way, she has found many things that the church does that are not Biblical. She continues going to her parents' church to support them, but she also loves going to Antonella's group. She is praying to know Jesus more and that her parents can know Him in a more intimate way too.

The virtual discipleship groups have been growing a lot more lately than Beto expected. He has met many people that have told him that they want to study the Bible, and some of them are people that attend the Catholic church. Soon he will be opening another virtual group for these people, so that they can grow in their relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ. Some people want to participate from places like Huarez, Juliaca, Iquitos, and Pucallpa, which are places that are far away from Huancayo where Beto lives. All the virtual groups and the in-person groups continue to study together. Biblical discipleship changes people's lives, but it is a process and takes a long time. It equips us all for growing in Jesus, for teaching others to grow in Him, and for being capable of doing God's work.

In September, two groups of people from the two churches that participated by working in the medical campaign have formed a team to go visit the new believers and those people that are interested about knowing Jesus. They met together with Beto for two days to pray, to study the Bible, and to do some of the follow-up for the people that heard the gospel during the medical campaign in La Merced.

While on the trip to the farm, Beto visited Roder Beltran, who has a greenhouse in the city of Mazamari. About a year ago, Roder gave him information about plants, seeds, and everything concerning the growth of cacao. He is the person that provided the new plants for the farm.

The cacao harvest was 4900 kilos, and the company that bought it paid a higher price that helped us to have a better profit. The farm team has treated the plagues that were affecting the cacao plants. In October, they are hoping to clean and prune the plants. The bananas have finished their harvest season, and now the farm team is looking for buyers that will buy the banana leaves that are taken from the plants. The house at the farm is being repaired, and the weakened parts are being made stronger.


Prayer Requests and Praises for October
